- The game consists of 12 ends on 4 rinks for either triples or 4's depending on numbers.
- Max 32 players each League night and names entered on the night
- The game is scored with 3 points for the nearest wood, 2 for the second and 1 for the third nearest. So 6 points are available each end.
- The score cards are given in at the end of the game so that the league table can be updated for each member taking part.
- Members must play in a minimum of 8 Tues eve league sessions to qualify for the trophy.

Come along and support the League, get some practice and get the chance to bowl with different members.

There will be 2 rinks free on league/club fun nights for any county or district games.

These will still take priority.



So this win has set us up well for the return match at home on 29 July. At Ladygate on 30th April we won on 2 rinks, lost on 1 and drew on 1; overall we lost by 23 shots. *Our top rink was Ivy Fennell and Keith Fennell (each playing 50/50), Aaron Langley, Jenny Gauthier and Sheila Rob-*

erts. This was our first fixture with Ladygate, which is quite a big club, and was played in a competitive but friendly atmosphere throughout.

Warners 2018

Our Pre—season break to Warners 2018 is booked for Gunton Hall - Suffolk, close to Great Yarmouth. The dates booked are Fri 13th April until Mon 16th April. Our usual dates - 31st March - is the Easter weekend so we have opted for the weekend before the season starts when the evenings are a bit lighter n search of the sunshine again.

The rooms reserved are:

Standard Single - £184

Standard Single - new room £194

Standard Double - £164 pp

Double New room - £179

New Twin room - £179 pp

Garden Lodge - £224 pp

These prices are yet to be confirmed as we get 1 free place with every 20 places booked so might be a little bit cheaper hopefully.

I spent a weekend there on a reckie mission and it is a bigger venue than hailing Island set in lovley surroundings. The spa treatments can be pre booked before arrival so we can have one on arrival on the Friday if we want. The pool is much bigger with a sauna and a steam room. The games complex has a 4 rink bowls hall with darts, table tennis tables and a pool table to the side with a separate room housing 2 snooker tables.

I have spoken to the manager of the bowls hall and he is happy to reserve all 4 rinks for us on the Saturday and Sunday mornings for our chocolate drive and Competition.

I have also spoken to the restaurant manager who will be happy to accommodate us all together in an area of the restaurant.

The entertainment areas are separate from the dining area and there is a big dance floor stage etc in one area where the band play and where the shows are. There is also seating in the bar area and another entertainment lounge that usually has a singer entertaining. The setting is lovely with a nice pitch and putt (tried that out) with the sea and beach behind it and a river running through the resort with some nice walks along it. I Saw a man fishing and was very tempted to join him! South Wold and Great Yarmouth are close by on bus routes. They also do coach trips I think.

From speaking to members don't think there will be enough interest for a coach but we do have some members who are willing to take some passengers there and back.

The deposit required is £30 pp by the 1st July and the balance by end of January 2018. You can also pay by instalments through out the year if that is easier. It really is a lovely way to get everyone back together before the season starts.
